Simultaneous Elections: Making Democracy Great Again For Some By - Mayank Veerwani

In recent political discourse, the proposition of 'One Nation One Election' has resurfaced, purportedly aimed at simultaneous elections for the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies. A reminiscent echo of pre-1967 practices, this concept, however, demands a closer inspection concerning its impact on democracy, practical feasibility, financial and political ramifications, as well as the formidable administrative challenges it poses.

Beyond the veneer of modernity and practicality, it becomes apparent that 'One Nation One Election' is not merely a proposition; it is a strategic move by the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to consolidate power both at the Central and State levels. Riding on the statistic that indicates a 77% likelihood of a voter supporting the same party in simultaneous elections (IDFC Institute), the BJP could potentially establish a formidable dominance, reducing both financial expenditure and the repetitive electoral burden.

However, this seemingly progressive concept encounters a stumbling block—the eight-member committee led by Shri Ram Nath Kovind tasked with exploring its feasibility. The committee, seemingly predisposed in favor of the BJP, raises questions about its objectivity and impartiality. The specter of bias looms large, casting a shadow over the committee's credibility.

In proposing a more pragmatic alternative, it is imperative to pivot towards reinforcing Centre-State relations. Rather than a sweeping overhaul, focus should be on refining existing processes. While historical precedents may have accommodated such a strategy, the evolving landscape demands a nuanced approach that respects the dynamism of our political system.

A new committee with representation of individuals from all fields should be constituted. Work should be done on strengthening the Centre-State relations, and elections should be conducted as they are conducted today. Though this concept was applicable in the past, it cannot be applied today, considering changes are required as time advances.
